New Partnership for Africa's Development: progress in implementation and international support

Pakistan:* draft resolution

New Partnership for Africa's Development: modalities, format and organization of the high-level meeting on Africa's development needs

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolution 61/229 of 22 December 2006, in which it decided to convene, during its sixty-third session, a high-level meeting on "Africa's development needs: state of implementation of various commitments, challenges and the way forward",

Recalling also the 2005 World Summit Outcome¹ and its follow-up resolution 60/265 of 30 June 2006,

Recalling further its resolutions 57/270 B of 23 June 2003, 61/230 of 22 December 2006 and 61/296 of 17 September 2007 and the ministerial declaration of the high-level segment of the substantive session of 2001 of the Economic and Social Council, entitled "The role of the United Nations in support of the efforts of African countries to achieve sustainable development", of 18 July 2001,²

Reaffirming its determination to address the special needs of Africa, which is the only continent not on track to meet the Millennium Development Goals by 2015,

Noting that the full implementation of commitments made to Africa by its development partners will contribute to the continent's achievement of the Millennium Development Goals by 2015,

Convinced that the high-level meeting will constitute a significant event at which to review the implementation of all commitments made to Africa in order to comprehensively address the special development needs of the continent,

1. *Decides* that the high-level meeting will be held on 22 September 2008, prior to the general debate of the sixty-third session of the General Assembly;

2. *Also decides* that the high-level meeting will be held with the participation of Heads of State and Government, and encourages all Member States to be represented at that level;

3. *Further decides* that the meeting will be composed of four plenary meetings;

4. *Decides* that the meeting will result in an agreed outcome;

5. *Strongly urges* all Member States to actively participate in the meeting;

6. *Stresses* the need for active participation of Africa's development partners in the meeting;

7. *Decides* that the preparation for the meeting will be conducted in close consultation between the United Nations and the African Union;

8. *Invites* the Holy See, in its capacity as Observer State, and Palestine, in its capacity as observer, to participate in the meeting;

9. *Decides* that the plenary meetings shall be organized in accordance with the rules of procedure of the General Assembly;

10. *Also decides* that the meeting will be chaired by the President of the General Assembly;

11. *Invites* intergovernmental organizations that have observer status with the General Assembly to participate in the meeting;

12. *Underlines* that heads of the United Nations funds, programmes and agencies may participate in the meeting, in consultation with the President of the General Assembly;

13. *Invites* the Bretton Woods institutions, the World Trade Organization, the regional development banks and the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development to participate in the meeting;

14. *Requests* the Secretary-General to submit to the meeting a comprehensive report, with recommendations, on "Africa's development needs: state of implementation of various commitments, challenges and the way forward" in cooperation with relevant development agencies of the United Nations, the Bretton Woods institutions and other relevant regional and international financial and trade institutions, two months before the meeting, as well as a note on the organizational aspects of the meeting.
