World Summit on Food Security

The General Assembly,

Recalling the Rio Declaration on Environment and Development,¹ Agenda 21,² the Programme for the Further Implementation of Agenda 21,³ the Johannesburg Declaration on Sustainable Development⁴ and the Plan of Implementation of the World Summit on Sustainable Development ("Johannesburg Plan of Implementation"),⁵ the Monterrey Consensus of the International Conference on Financing for Development,⁶ the 2005 World Summit Outcome,⁷ the Doha Declaration on Financing for Development: outcome document of the Follow-up International Conference on Financing for Development to Review the

Implementation of the Monterrey Consensus,⁸ and the Conference on the World Financial and Economic Crisis and its Impact on Development,⁹

Reaffirming the goal set out in paragraph 19 of the United Nations Millennium Declaration, ¹⁰ to halve, by 2015, the proportion of the world's people whose income is less than one dollar a day and the proportion of people who suffer from hunger,

Recalling the Rome Declaration on World Food Security and the World Food Summit Plan of Action,¹¹ the Declaration of the World Food Summit: five years later,¹² including the goal of achieving food security for all through an ongoing effort to eradicate hunger in all countries, with an immediate view to reducing by half the number of undernourished people by no later than 2015, as well as the commitment to achieving the Millennium Development Goals,

Convinced of the urgent need, at the highest political level, to marshal the global consensus and commitments to increase efforts at the national, regional and international levels to address food security and agriculture development as part of the international development agenda,

Conscious that, despite the progress that has been made in ensuring global food availability and security, 1.02 billion people remain chronically undernourished,

Bearing in mind the holding of the High-Level Expert Forum on How to Feed the World in 2050, which was approved by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) Conference in November 2007, and the summit proposal of the Director-General of FAO and the objectives contained therein,

1. *Welcomes* the agreement by the FAO Council at its hundred and thirtysixth session to convene a world summit on food security in November 2009, in close proximity to the FAO Conference;

2. *Invites* Governments to participate actively in the preparations and to be represented at the level of Heads of State or Government at the summit;

3. *Encourages* an action-oriented outcome that builds on actions and efforts already undertaken to addressing the issue of food security;

4. *Invites* all relevant United Nations and other intergovernmental organizations, including international and regional trade, financial and economic institutions, as well as non-governmental organizations and the private sector, to cooperate actively with FAO in preparing for the summit;

5. *Welcomes* the contributions made so far, and invites the international community to make further contributions on a voluntary basis to the special trust fund established by FAO in order to facilitate the preparations for and the holding of the summit;

6. *Invites* the Director-General of FAO to submit to the General Assembly, at its sixty-fourth session, through the Economic and Social Council, a report on the outcome of the summit, including actions to be taken to follow up on the outcome of the summit at all appropriate levels.
